CORONA VIRUS - SOURCE OF THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC

Government instructions are:

- · Stay at home
- . Only go outside for food, health reasons or work (but only if you cannot work from home)
- If you go out, stay 2 metres (6.5ft) away from other people at all times
- Wash your hands as soon as you get home (and avoid touching your face!)
- Do not meet others (not in your household), even friends or family. You can spread the virus even if you don't have symptoms.

Clearly, we are now living through very unprecedented times. Even during WW 2 people were still able to move around and socialise, and in fact socialising was actively encouraged as a way of maintaining morale. Now we find ourselves severely restricted in order to combat the situation we are in. However, like our forebears, people are finding new and innovative ways to socialise. The internet has become an indispensable tool; facilitating everything from shopping to virtual gatherings of families and friends. But many who do not have access to the internet or their friends and families, face isolation and this is especially true for our elder villagers and other vulnerable groups. So it is at times like these the strength of our community shines through. Here are a few of the things that our community is doing now:

A Facebook Group - Hassocks Volunteers and COVID-19 - You should have received a leaflet through your door about this support group. If you are a local resident who needs support, or if you know of somebody who perhaps does not have friends or family locally to support them who may need help during these times, you should feel free to contact this group. This special Facebook page, 'Hassocks & Keymer Volunteers — Covid19' has been set up specifically to enable people to reach out for help. The group can help with shopping, prescriptions, befriending phone calls and much more. Additionally, you can contact the group to offer help or ideas. Age Concern – Hassocks has closed the centre in Dale Avenue from Monday 23rd March until further notice, following government advice.
